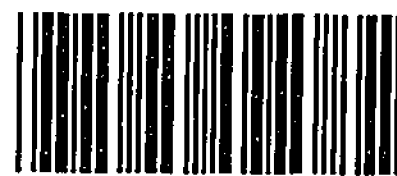

Thereupon said Tenore caught deponent by the whiskers, struck him on the face, and by force and violence and through fear on the part of deponent compelled deponent to surrender to him said money. Others acting with said Tenore stood about deponent when said money was taken. Two were close to deponent and a large number in the room.

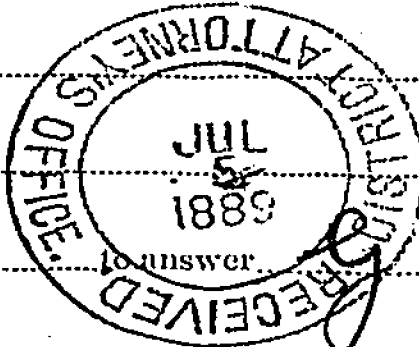

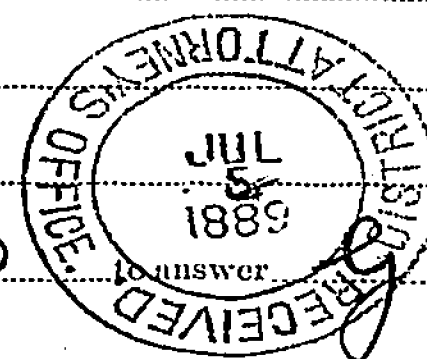

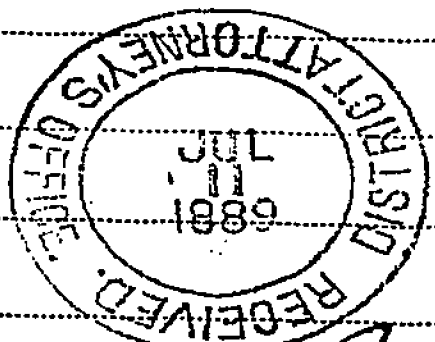
