Works as a stock clerk in Hotel Wines and Liquors of 877 7th Ave. near 56 St, has been an OAAU member since June 1964 but is not a member of the MMI.

I entered the hall at about 2:15 PM, on Feb. 21, 1965, and I sat in a back seat alone around booth #17. My usual capacity as a member of OAAU is to pass out leaflets, and popularize the functions of the OAAU. I never was a guard or usher because I was never a member of Mosque # 7 as ushers or guards on the rest-room. In the same area was a Leonard Sneed, Peter Bailey and one named Donald Stephenson they were in and around me at various times. I was standing behind the booths when I heard the commotion, I then heard a shot, silence, and then a variety of shots. Malcolm stood up, then during the second fusillade was seen to fall over backwards. I then heard shots all over the place and stayed behind the booths until they subsided. I then ran to the ~~hazards~~ stage to see if I could be of some assistance, but Malcolm looked dead. Then some policemen came with a stretcher and carried Malcolm out, I then went out front and milled around. CASE ACTIVE.
