The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse

- Sena Zimmerman -

of the CRIME OF GRAND LARCENY IN THE *second* DEGREE, committed as follows:

The said *Sena Zimmerman*,

late of the First Ward of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid on the *fourth* day of *march*, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-*six*, at the Ward, City and County aforesaid, with force and arms,

two watches of the value of three dollars each, one ring of the value of thirty five dollars, five other rings of the value of two dollars each, two earrings of the value of two dollars and fifty cents each, and one dove button of the value of one dollar,

of the goods, chattels and personal property of one *Otto Menners*,

then and there being found, then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York, and their dignity.
