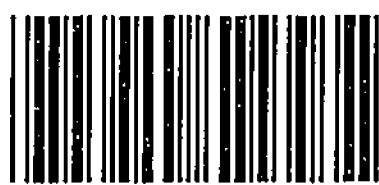

Frederic Morris

The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse

of the CRIME OF *Assault in the first degree*, committed as follows:

The said *Frederic Morris*

late of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the *fourth* day of *October*, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty *four*, with force and arms, at the City and County aforesaid, in and upon the body of *Mauda Judins*, in the peace of the said People then and there being, feloniously did make an assault, and to, at and against *her* the said *Mauda Judins*, a certain *revolver* then and there loaded and charged with gunpowder and one leaden bullet, which the said *Frederic Morris* in *her* right hand then and there had and held, the same being a deadly and dangerous weapon, wilfully and feloniously, did then and there shoot off and discharge, with intent *to kill* the said *Mauda Judins* thereby then and there feloniously and wilfully to kill, against the form of the Statute in such case made and provided. and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity.

SECOND COUNT.

And the Grand Jury aforesaid, by this indictment, further accuse the said

of the Crime of assault in the second degree, committed as follows:

The said *Frederic Morris*

afterwards, to wit, on the day and in the year aforesaid, at the City and County aforesaid, with force and arms, in and upon the body of the said *Mauda Judins*, then and there being, feloniously did, wilfully and wrongfully, make an assault, and to, at and against *her* the said *Mauda Judins*, a certain *revolver* then and there loaded and charged with gunpowder and one leaden bullet, which *he* the said *Frederic Morris* in *her* right hand, then and there had and held, the same being an instrument likely to produce grievous bodily harm, feloniously did, wilfully and wrongfully then and there shoot off and discharge

against the form of the Statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity.
