




looked and saw the chain fall down, and then I saw the defendant going away. I then felt for my watch and it was gone. I looked around and I didn't see the defendant, and I thought it was no use, and I would go home. I did see the defendant standing at the door of a restaurant about five paces away. I looked up and recognized him. I am positive that the defendant at the bar is the same man. He went in the restaurant, and afterwards came out, and walked one block, and then turned round a corner and ran another block, and slipped into a house. As he was going into the house he looked at me. I got a police officer and we went into the house after him, and had him arrested. I have never seen my watch since.

Cross-examination.

There were 30 or 40 persons in that crowd. I only stood about two minutes before my watch was taken. I cannot tell whether it was the defendant or somebody else that was leaning against me. It was a tenement house that the defendant ran into.

ADAM FEHR, a witness for the people sworn, testified:

On the 17th of February I was on Park Row in this city at about two o'clock in the afternoon. I saw the complainant and the defendant there. I stopped when I saw the crowd and the boy selling cards. I noticed the defendant at the bar lean over and put his hand into the complainant's pocket. He then went and stood by a restaurant, and looked around, and Mr.

Friedericks was going to walk away and I went up to him and asked him if he had his watch. He put his hand in his pocket and found the watch was gone. We then followed this man round about three blocks, and he went into a house. I couldn't tell the street on which the house was situated. He went in through the hallway and into the water closet which was in the back yard. A policeman came in with us and arrested the man. Cross-examination.

The defendant stood on the right side of Mr Friedericks at the time he took the watch. He took the watch with his right hand. I was standing near the restaurant. I was about five feet away from the two parties, and could see everything plainly. The man who was selling pictures was only about two feet away from me. The defendant went into the restaurant but he only stayed there about two minutes and came out again. When he came out I told Mr. Friedericks that that was the man who took his watch. The man then started on a quick walk, and we overtook him and had him arrested.

BERNARD NEVINS, a witness for the people, sworn testified:

I am an officer of the Municipal Police of this City. On the 17th day of February I arrested the defendant at No. 489 Pearl Street in the yard. I went in there and pulled the door open, and told him to come out. He asked me what was the matter, and I told him

that these people accused him of stealing a watch. He said he didn't take a watch. I then arrested him. Cross-examination.

Q Did you find anything on him? A. No sir.

D E F E N S E .

WILLIAM EAYRS, the defendant, sworn, testified:

I live in Hoboken N. J. at No. 14 Willow Avenue. I was in New York on the 17th of February last. On that day I came over from Hoboken and went to see my sister. After I had seen her I came down-town as far as Grand Street. When I got to Grand Street I got off the car and walked down to Park Row. On Park Row I saw a little fellow selling some kind of cards, and I just stopped to see what he was selling. I didn't stay there a second. I walked on about my business. When I got about two blocks away, I went into a tenement house to go to the water closet, and while I was in there the officer came in and arrested me. I did not take this man's watch. I didn't have anything to do with the taking of it. I have never been arrested for anything at all. I am a laborer, and the last place I worked was in the Brown stone yard in Hoboken.

Cross- examination.

I worked for four months at my last place. I never sold any transparent cards on the street. I had nothing at all to do on this day that I was arrested. I just stopped on Park Row as a matter of curiosity, to see what this boy was selling. I was on my way back and I intended to take the ferry across at Barclay Street. I had nothing at all to do with the taking of this man's watch.


