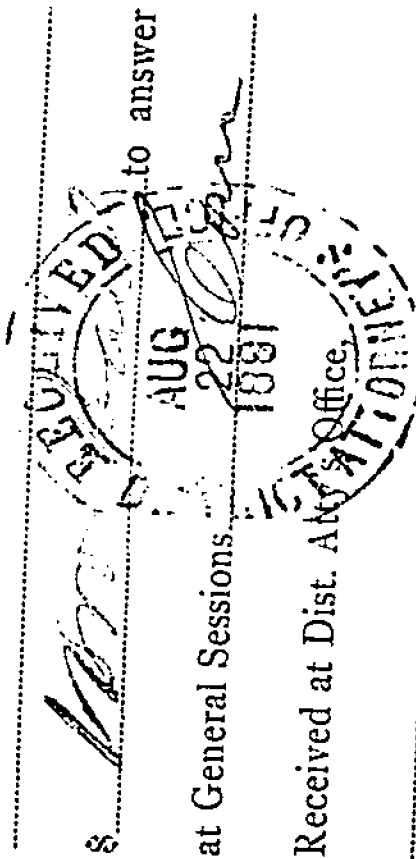

burglariously, did break into and enter, the same being a building in which divers
goods, merchandise, and valuable things were then and there kept for use, sale and
deposit, to wit: the goods, chattels, and personal property hereinafter described, with
intent the said goods, chattels, and personal property of the said

Michael Heumann then and there being, then and there
feloniously and burglariously to steal, take and carry away, and

One coat of the value of eight dollars
One vest of the value of two dollars
One pair of pantaloons of the value of
five dollars

of the goods, chattels, and personal property of the said

there, feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the Statute in
