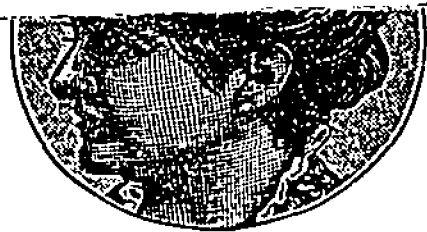

Fredinda Ingham

of the CRIME OF GRAND LARCENY IN THE *second* DEGREE, committed
as follows:

The said *Fredinda Ingham*,

Twenty-fourth late of the First Ward of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the *fourth* day of *July* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-*seven*, at the City and County aforesaid, with force and arms,

two fully furnished sets of the value of thirty dollars each,

of the goods, chattels and personal property of one

George E. Chadbourne,

then and there being found, then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York, and their dignity.
