The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse
Henry Zimmer and James Murray
of the CRIME OF GRAND LARCENY in the *Second* degree, committed as follows:

The said *Henry Zimmer and James Murray*, each

late of the First Ward of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the
twenty seventh day of *July* — in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and eighty-~~four~~, at the Ward, City and County aforesaid, with force and arms,
forty pounds of pecan nuts of the
value of twenty cents each pound,
one basket of the value of one
dollar, one box of peanuts of
the value of two dollars, one
box of oranges of the value of
eleven dollars, five watermelons
of the value of twenty five cents
each and five hundred bananas
of the value of two cents each

of the goods, chattels and personal property of one *Maurice Barnett*

then and there being found, then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form
of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New
York and their dignity.
