

license expired by its terms on the 15th day of October,
1896, and that deponent some time in the latter part of the
month of July or in the month of August, 1896, finding said
license in a closet behind the bar in said premises and
believing the same to be of no further use or value des-
troyed the same by tearing it to pieces and throwing it in
the ash-barrel.



Herman Sanders, being duly sworn, deposes and says, that he is the plaintiff above named. That he signed the original application for a license to sell liquors at No. 1205 First Avenue, in the City of New York, and paid ~~for~~ the Board of Excise of the City of New York the sum of Two hundred Dollars for the license that was issued to him, which was to expire by its terms on the 15th day of October, 1896, and that of his own knowledge said license was destroyed by Henry Sanders, deponent's nephew, sometime in the month of July or August, said Henry Sanders being then in deponent's employ, as bar-keeper, he said Sanders believing that said license was of no further use or value.




