eighty-three, at the Ward, City and County aforesaid, with force and arms

three promissory notes for the pay-
ment of money, the same being
then and there one and unsatisfied
of the kind known as United States
Treasury notes of the denomination
and of the value of three dollars each,
three promissory notes for the pay-
ment of money, the same being
then and there one and unsatisfied of the
kind known as Bank notes of the
denomination and of the value of five
dollars each, one promissory note for
the payment of money, the same being
then and there one and unsatisfied of the
kind known as United States Treasury
notes of the denomination and of the
value of ten dollars, one promissory
note for the payment of money, the same
being then and there one and unsatisfied
of the kind known as Bank notes of the
denomination and of the value of the
ten dollars, and four silver coins of the
United States of the kind known as
trade dollars, of the value of one
dollar each

of the goods, chattels and personal property of one John
Maroney then and there being found, then and there
feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the Statute in such case
made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York, and
their dignity.

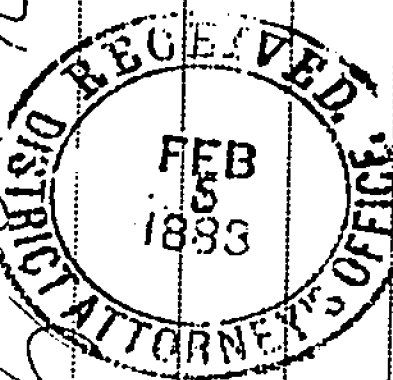
