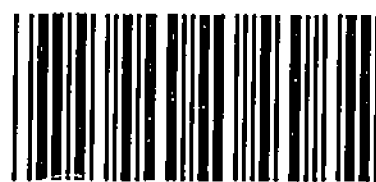

The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse

Rosario Imperials and Ammodio Dominico

of the CRIME OF ASSAULT IN THE FIRST DEGREE, committed as follows:

The said *Rosario Imperials and Ammodio Dominico*, each

late of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the *twenty-six* day of *November*, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty *four*, with force of arms, at the City and County aforesaid, in and upon the body of one *Ajira Songene* in the peace of the said People then and there being, feloniously did make an assault and *kill* the said *Ajira Songene* — with a certain *knife* —

which the said *Rosario Imperials and Ammodio Dominico* in *their* right hands then and there had and held, the same being a deadly and dangerous weapon, wilfully and feloniously did beat, strike, stab, cut and wound

with intent *kill* the said *Ajira Songene*, thereby then and there feloniously and wilfully to kill, against the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity.

SECOND COUNT:

And the Grand Jury aforesaid, by this indictment, further accuse the said

Rosario Imperials and Ammodio Dominico

of the CRIME OF ASSAULT IN THE SECOND DEGREE, committed as follows:

The said *Rosario Imperials and Ammodio Dominico*, each —

late of the City and County of New York, on the *twenty-six* day of *November*, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-*four*, at the City and County aforesaid, with force and arms, in and upon the body of one *Ajira Songene*, — in the peace of the said People then and there being, feloniously did wilfully and wrongfully make an assault, and *kill* the said *Ajira Songene*, — with a certain *knife* —

which *they* the said *Rosario Imperials and Ammodio Dominico* in *their* right hands then and there had and held, the same being an *instrument* likely to produce grievous bodily harm, then and there feloniously did wilfully and wrongfully beat, strike, stab, cut and wound against the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity.
