The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse

*Julius Rosenberg* —

of the CRIME OF BURGLARY IN THE *second* DEGREE, committed as follows:

The said *Julius Rosenberg*,

late of the *Eleventh* Ward of the City of New York, in the County of New York  
aforesaid, on the *eight* day of *October*, in the year  
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty *eight*, with force and arms, about the  
hour of *three* o'clock in the *night* time of the same day, at the Ward,  
City and County aforesaid, the dwelling house of one *Simon Skindberg*.

there situate, feloniously and burglariously did break into and enter, there being then and there  
some human being, to wit: *The said Simon Skindberg* —

within the said dwelling house, with intent to commit some crime therein, to wit: the goods  
chattels and personal property of the said *Simon Skindberg*.

in the said dwelling house then and there being, then and there feloniously and burglariously to  
steal, take and carry away;

against the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People  
of the State of New York and their dignity,

SECOND COUNT—

AND THE GRAND JURY AFORESAID, by this indictment further accuse the said

*John P. Hemenway* —

of the CRIME OF *Robt* LARCENY, —

committed as follows:

The said *John P. Hemenway*,

late of the Ward, City and County aforesaid, afterwards, to wit: on the day and in the year aforesaid,  
at the Ward, City and County aforesaid, in the *night* time of the said day, with force and arms,

*one spoon of the value of one dollar,*  
*one watch of the value of ten dollars,*  
*one chain of the value of three dollars,*  
*one pair of trousers of the value of*  
*five dollars, and the sum of two*  
*dollars in money, lawful money of*  
*the United States and of the value of*  
*two dollars,*

of the goods, chattels and personal property of one *Simon Skindberg* —

in the dwelling house of the said *Simon Skindberg*. —

there situate, then and there being found, from the dwelling house aforesaid, then and there  
feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the statute in such case made and  
provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity.

by a certain person or persons to the Grand Jury aforesaid unknown, then lately before feloniously stolen, taken and carried away from the said *Simon Steinberg* —

unlawfully and unjustly, did feloniously receive and have; the said

*Julius Rosenberg* —

then and there well knowing the said goods, chattels and personal property to have been feloniously stolen, taken and carried away, against the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity.
