## RESULTS OF EXAMINATION OR ANALYSIS:

1. At approximately 5:00 P.M. this date, the writer and Detective Russell Schaefer SA # 2532, Police Laboratory, at the request of the above mentioned Detective, responded to the Audubon Ballroom, 564 West 116 Street, Manhattan, to aid in the investigation of a homicide.
2. At approximately 3:05 P.M. this date, One Malcolm Little (Malcolm X) was shot and killed as he spoke from the stage of the above mentioned location. It is alleged that he was shot by two male negroes, (one Thomas Hagen M-N-22yrs and another unidentified negro ).
3. At this location two men's topcoats which were left behind in this hall after the shooting were examined for any laundry and dry cleaning marks. No such marks were found. A rear door through which one of the perpetrators is said to have fled was processed for latent fingerprints. No prints of value were developed. A search and examination of this location failed to reveal any other clues or traces that would aid this investigation.
4. At the 34th Precinct Station House a sawed off shotgun (J.C. Higgins Model # 1017) was processed for latent fingerprints. No prints of value were developed. A man's shirt jacket in which this weapon was found was also examined. No laundry or dry cleaning marks were found. An eyeglass case and a pack of Camel cigarettes found in this jacket were also processed for latent fingerprints with negative results. Nothing further to report.

## RESULTS OF EXAMINATION OR ANALYSIS:

1. On this date, Detective Joseph Reich Sh # 2197, Ballistics Squad, delivered to the laboratory the gun above listed. This gun was disassembled by Detective Reich and the parts, together with the clip and bullets were processed for latent fingerprints by the writer and Detective Russell Schaefer # 2532, Police Laboratory. Attached B.O.I. report describes prints developed. This evidence was returned to Detective Reich, except for the three bullets, which will be retained at the laboratory.

2. The mark sock and contents above listed were returned to the laboratory by Sgt. Xavier Olivo Sh # 1068 Police Laboratory. At the laboratory this evidence was photographed before it was opened. When this sock was opened, the following contents were noticed: one white handkerchief wrapped around a roll of Kodacolor film ( paper backing in tact, film itself broken into seven pieces), one white handkerchief wrapped around chopped up safety matches, and paper and wooden matches placed in end of sock. This sock and its contents were soaked in a solution of a volatile liquid. An additional report will follow when further chemical examinations of this liquid are completed. Examination of the two handkerchiefs failed to reveal and laundry or dry cleaning marks. The film found in the sock was processed for latent fingerprints by the writer and Det. Schaefer. Attached B.O.I. report describes prints developed.

3. Copies of photographs mentioned in paragraph # 2 will be retained at the laboratory until such time as requests are made for same.
