Dear Sir:-

Since his appointment as City marshal, Mr. Morris Einstein of No. 311 East Fourth Street, has attended to the service of summonses and collection of judgments on execution in all the District Court matters for this Society. The work was very trying and the judgments collected were frequently for very small amounts. The parties with whom Mr. Einstein dealt were of such a class that a less conscientious or painstaking man would soon have been discouraged as the fees he obtained for his trouble were very small. I know that in many cases Mr. Einstein went again and again to judgment debtors and collected judgments by such dribblets as one or two dollars at a time and in many instances he has waived his fees.

I have been the attorney for this Society for almost five years and in each year I have had several hundred cases in the District Courts as such attorney. Before Mr. Einstein was appointed marshal, complaints were justly lodged from week to week against the marshals whom I employed. They were not conscientious and when a claim was small would not even take the trouble of seeing the party against whom the execution was issued. For the last two years, since Mr. Einstein has been doing the marshal work of the Society, there have been no complaints against him and I know that he is just as painstaking when the execution is for two or three dollars as he is when the execution is for a large amount. In fact, I do not hesitate to state that Mr. Einstein has made himself practically indispensable to this Society. I heartily recommend his re-appointment as City marshal.
