

The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse *Seneadore Nodders*

of the CRIME OF GRAND LARCENY IN THE *second* DEGREE, committed as follows:

The said *Seneadore Nodders*,

late of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the *nineteenth* day of *October*, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and *eighty nine*, at the City and County aforesaid, with force and arms, *two hundred seven pictures of the value of one cent each, four key rings of the value of thirty three cents each, twelve pairs of China dolls of the value of ninety cents each pair, nine hundred and thirty six key matches of the value of eight cents each, eight hundred dice of the value of one cent each, one hundred and ninety eight harmonicas of the value of fourteen cents each, one hundred and forty four iron sharp of the value of eight cents each, seventy two pen holders of the value of one cent each, one hundred and twenty stockings of the value of three cents each, two hundred and twenty five pages of the value of five cents each, two pairs of protectors of the value of ninety cents each pair, one pair of key chains of the value of one cent each, one round of rubber of the value of seventy five cents, seventy two rubber bands of the value of one cent each, and thirty six magnets of the value of seven cents each,*

of the goods, chattels and personal property of one *George A. Johnston*,

then and there being found, then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York, and their dignity.

then and there well knowing the said goods, chattels and personal property to have been feloniously stolen, taken and carried away, against the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity.
