he was violently and feloniously ASSAULTED and BEATEN by

Stephen J. Womey (now here) who did  
cut and stab deponent in the abdomen  
with the blade of a knife then and  
there held in his hand causing  
a serious wound

with the felonious intent to take the life of deponent, or to do him grievous bodily harm; and without any justification on the part of the said assailant :

Wherefore this deponent prays that the said assailant may be ~~apprehended~~ and bound to answer for the above assault, etc., and be dealt with according to law.
