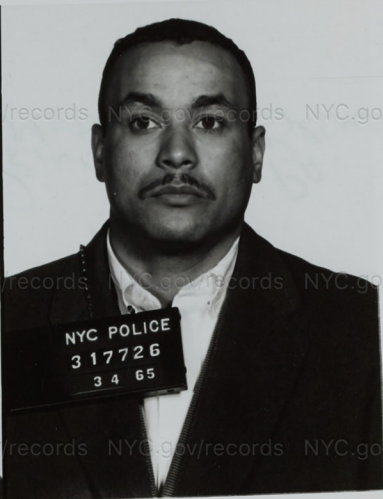

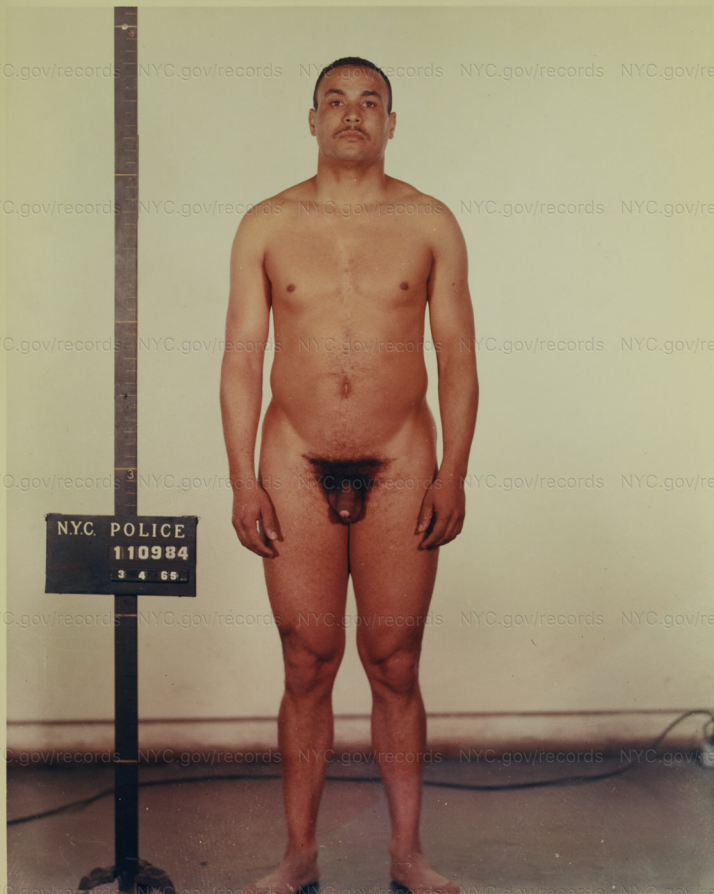

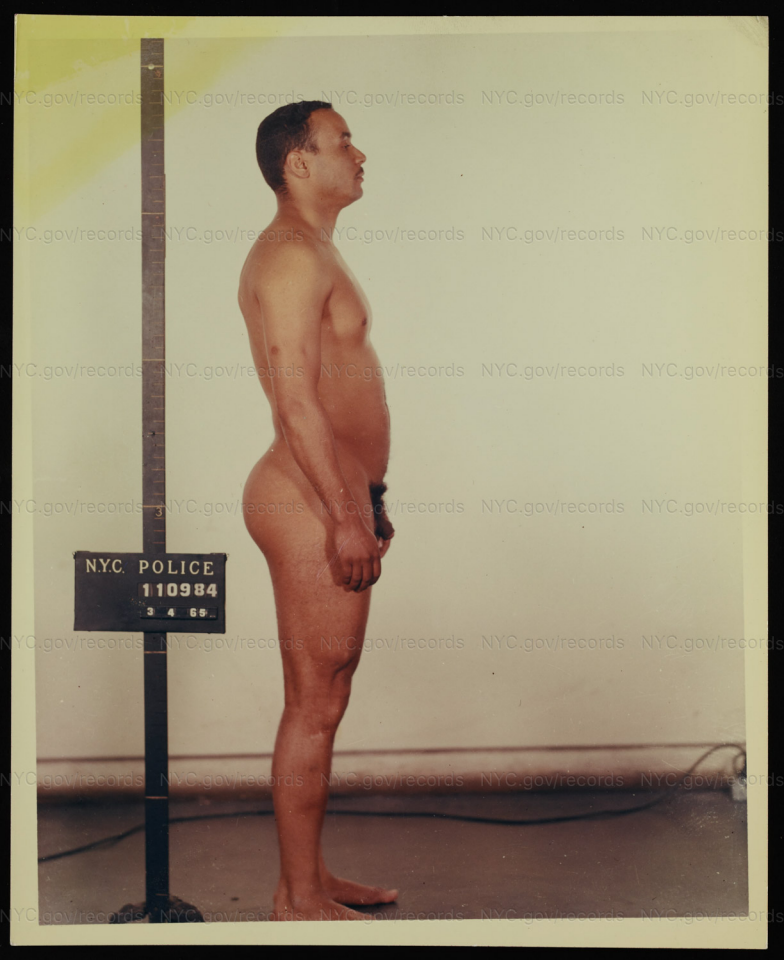

F E R D I N A N D C A V A L L E R O, a police officer
of the City of New York, Shield No. 409,
assigned to the 34th Squad Detectives, called as
a witness, being duly sworn, testified as follows:

BY MR. STERN:

Q Detective Cavallero, on February 26, 1965,
at about 3 o'clock in the morning, did you have an
occasion to interview a man who identified himself to
you as Norman 3X Butler, at the 34th Squad station house?

A Yes, sir, I did.

Q I direct your attention to the four
photographs on the table before you, labeled Grand Jury
Exhibits 1 through 4, and I ask you if you see a photograph
of the man who identified himself to you that day as Norman
3X Butler?

A I do.

Q Will you indicate which one it is?

A This one right here.

Q And you are indicating Grand Jury Exhibit
No. 3, is that right?

A Yes, that is correct.

Q Now, among other questions, did you ask

Norman 3X Butler whether he was a member of the Elijah Muhammad Muslim movement?

A Yes, I did.

Q What did he say?

A He replied in the affirmative. He said he was a member of the Black Muslims and that he was attached to Mosque No. 7, from the Bronx.

Q And at that time did you ask him his opinion of Malcolm X?

A Yes, sir, I did.

Q What did he say?

A He replied to me that Malcolm X was thrown out of the Black Muslims, specifically Mosque 7, and that he was a traitor to ~~ELIJAH~~ Elijah Muhammad, who was the messenger of Allah. He further embellished that Malcolm had brought disgrace upon the Black Muslims.

Q Did you ask him questions concerning the duty of obedience that he owed to the Messenger, or Elijah Muhammad?

A Yes, sir, I did. To this he replied that Elijah Muhammad is the Messenger, who receives messages from Allah, and that anyone coming under Elijah Muhammad,

specifically he, himself, would obey anything that was transported to him, which Elijah Muhammad had --

Q Commanded?

A That's a good word, yes, commanded, right.

Q In other words, in essence, detective --

A Well, in essence he stated that he would do anything at all, anything that Elijah Muhammad told him to do in the name of Allah.

Q He also told you that Elijah Muhammad had not ordered him to kill Malcolm X, is that correct?

A That is correct.

Q Now, did you ask him where he had been on February 21, 1965, that Sunday?

A Yes, sir, I did.

Q What did he tell you?

A He said that on February 21st he went to the Jacobi Hospital for an ailment to his right leg, and that he got out of the hospital sometime in the morning, whereupon he drove to buy the newspapers, and went home. He said he arrived home at approximately 1 p.m., where he stayed alone with his wife and children, and he stayed there, as a matter of fact, he said until he went to the doctor again on Thursday.

Q And did he tell you among other things that that Sunday, February 21st, he could only hobble with great pain, and could barely walk?

A Yes, sir, he did.

Q And in addition, did you ask him other questions?

A Yes, sir, I did.

Q Now, did there come a time several hours later when you had an occasion to see Norman 3X Butler -- withdrawn. Did there come a time several hours later when you saw the left leg of Norman 3X Butler?

A Yes, sir.

Q Now, will you describe what, if anything, you saw on his leftleg?

A Well, I noticed on the left leg, in the area of the shin, a very large knot, and a bad bruise.

Q Now, when Norman 3X Butler told you that he had gone to the hospital, did he tell you which leg he had gone to have treated at that time, that Sunday, February 21st?

A Yes, sir, he did.

Q Which leg did he say it was?

A The right leg.

Q Now, did you have occasion to see his right leg at the same time you saw his left leg?

A Yes, sir.

Q Will you describe what you saw on his right leg?

A On the right leg I noticed two bruises in the shin area, I would say approximately three or four inches apart.

Q And there was a swelling, is that correct, officer?

A I didn't notice too much. There was a little swelling, but the most swelling that I noticed was on the left leg.

Q And at the time you interviewed him in the station house he was wearing a bandage on his right leg, is that correct?
