I am not a member of the Black Muslims, or the O.A.A.U., or the Muslim Mosque Inc.

On Feb. 21, 1965 I was at the audubon ballroom and seated with a friend Willie Jones, and another person unknown to me in booth #3, on the left side of stage as you face it. Malcolm X reached to podium to speak, and a disturbance broke out in the left side of seats facing the stage about 20 rows from the front. I did not see the persons making the disturbance. Just then a shot rang out from somewhere, I do not know from where. This shot was followed by numerous other shots, about 20. Willie moved over an in my line of vision, I got on the floor. I did not see anyone shooting or anyone with a gun. I saw the photos of the three (3) men, (Norman Butler, Thomas Hagan, Thomas Johnson) and I cannot say whether these men were or were not present at the Audubon ballroom on Feb. 21, 1965, during the shooting.
