



George P. Eisenman,
being duly sworn, says: that he is a citizen
of the United States and resides at 1814 Fulton
Street, Brooklyn; that he is, and for nine and
a half years last past has been, the proprietor
of a liquor saloon at said 1814 Fulton Street;
and that on or about Aug 26, 1895, the late
Board of Excise of said City issued to deponent
a second class saloon license permitting him to
carry on such business at said place from
Aug. 16, 1895 to August 16, 1896; that on or
about July 1st 1896, deponent took out a new
license for said premises under the require-
ments of the present Liquor Tax Law and
at that time took down the said license
granted by the late Board of Excise from its
frame on the wall; that deponent was ig-
norant of the fact that it was in any way ne-
cessary to preserve said license, so as to secure
the rebate of the license fee thereon, and at about
that time he destroyed it, and consequently
is now unable to produce the said license or
certificate thereof on the presentation of his
claim for such rebate - That deponent is
the sole owner & holder of said license
last mentioned and is solely entitled to the
entire rebate thereon, and that no person
has any claim or lien thereon. That deponent
makes this statement and affords it as an
inducement to the City of Brooklyn to make
payment to him of such rebate, knowing
