aforesaid, the said *Frank Chixon*  
with force and arms, in and upon the body of the said *John Raymond*  
then and there being, wilfully and feloniously did make an  
assault and *him* the said *John Raymond*  
with a certain *knife* which the said *Frank Chixon*  
in *his* right hand, then and there  
had and held, the same being then and there a sharp, dangerous weapon, wilfully  
and feloniously, and without justifiable and excusable cause, did then and there beat,  
strike, stab, cut, and wound, with intent to then and there wilfully and feloniously  
do bodily harm unto *him* the said *John Raymond*  
against the form of the Statute in such case made and provided, and against the  
peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity.

THIRD COUNT.

And the Jurors aforesaid, upon their Oath aforesaid, do further present : That  
afterwards, to wit, on the day and in the year aforesaid, at the City and County afore-  
said, the said *Frank Chixon*  
with force and arms, in and upon the body of *John Raymond*  
in the peace of the said people then and there being, feloniously, did make another  
assault and *him* the said *John Raymond*  
with a certain *knife*

hand then and there had and held, wilfully and feloniously did beat, strike, stab, cut,  
and wound, the same being such means and force as was likely to produce the death

*Frank Chacon* with force and arms, in and upon the body of the said *John Raymond* then and there being, wilfully and feloniously, did make another assault and *kill* the said *John Raymond* with a certain *knife* which the said *Frank Chacon* in *his* right hand then and there had and held, the same being then and there a deadly weapon, wilfully and feloniously did then and there beat, strike, stab, cut and wound, with intent to then and there wilfully and feloniously maim *kill* the said *John Raymond* against the form of the Statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York, and their dignity.
