


and not to depart the Court without leave thereof, or of the United States Attorney, and that you produce at the time and place aforesaid the following:



**FOURTH CLASS (Parcel Post)** must weight 16 oz. or more; includes circulars, and other matter wholly in print, proof sheets, corrected proof sheets and manuscript copy accompanying registered and insured articles. Insurable matter not included in this list. For books and catalogues consult your postmaster.

For size and weight limitations see instruction under "Surface Parcel Post".

**SURFACE PARCELS:** Effective January 1, 1924, fourth-class or parcel-post matter (except by surface mail) of any size of the first class, second class or third class, in the United States will be limited in size to 72 inches in length and girth combined, and the maximum weight will be 40 pounds if for delivery in the first, second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, or eighth zones except that these limitations shall not apply to parcels containing baby food, live plants, trees, shrubs, agricultural commodities, or books and other items mailed at the educational or library rate or the library rate or to any parcel mailed at the library rate or to any parcel mailed at the star route, regardless of the class of the office of mailing or address.

The reduced limits of size and weight also do not apply to parcels mailed at the educational or library rate or to parcels mailed at the star route, or to parcels mailed in a United States possession or territory, an Army, Air Force or Navy post office, or a post office in the United States or in any other place outside the continental United States where the domestic mail service is in operation, nor to parcels mailed at the educational material rate or at the library material rate, regardless of where mailed.

Note — Parcels over 84 inches in length and girth combined, and less than 16 ounces in weight must be prepaid at 10 lbs. per cubic foot matter (parcel post) are available only at post offices and stations. Parcels must bear the return card of the sender otherwise they will not be accepted for mailing.

Fourth-class matter may be insured or sent C. O. D. up to a maximum of \$200 per parcel. Library books, in the open additional rate "up to 70 lbs.," except that the third of fourth-class rates shall apply, whether such rate is lower than at the library book rate.

The sender of a C. O. D. article will not be notified of non-delivery unless the article is endorsed to show that a notice is desired.

First class C. O. D. articles may be registered. The regular insured rate now applies plus a commission of 40%. The sender must comply with all other requirements governing preparation for C. O. D. service.

It should be borne in mind that, in no case, can the collection on any C. O. D. article exceed \$200; however, indemnity protection (against loss, rifling, or damage) in excess of \$200, can be procured by the prepayment of combination C. O. D. Registry loss (in addition to regular first class postage), up to a maximum delivery limit of \$10,000. Payment of a higher fee.

Mark envelopes or wrappers "Special Delivery" or "Special Handling", as the case may be.

Use distinctive "Special Delivery" or "Special Handling" stamps if obtainable.

**AIR MAIL** — Domestic Air Mail postage rate is 8¢ for each ounce or fraction thereof, regardless of distance or weight, up to and including 13.5 ounces and 10 inches each in length.

For the Armed Forces on the side of postage is 8¢ for each ounce or fraction thereof. Air to and including 8 ounces. The rate of 8¢ for the first pound (over 8 ounces) thereafter for the first 16 ounces, and 6¢ for each pound thereafter of all **REGISTERED**, **ARMED FORCES**, **REGISTERED** (See your Postmaster).

This figure includes all transportation to and from the various routes which now reach directly or indirectly, most of the important cities in the country.

All Air Mail may be sent Special Delivery and it is recommended for late afternoon, week end and holiday arrivals.

Although Air Mail is used mainly for letters, any suitable matter up to 70 pounds in weight and not exceeding 100 inches in length and eight thickness, may be carried (excepting such articles as are subject to postage by weight).

Articles that Air Mail may be carried by Special Delivery include the P. O. Department cards (the use of which requires Mail stamps, and distinctive Air Mail envelopes), horizontal and vertical photographs, postcards, stamps, and labels and blue paraffinogram holders) or similar unclipped labels.

Horizontal envelopes are used if it is recommended that two horizontal lines be drawn across the envelope, not less than 1½ inch from the top and bottom edges. Horizontal envelopes must be prepared in accordance with the regulations for such envelopes as framed or C. O. D. if otherwise conforming to third or fourth class requirements.

All Air Mail may be registered.
