While deponent and the said defendant were confined in the pen of the 2nd District Police Court awaiting their arraignment—before the police Justice at said police Court upon charges of disorderly conduct, and deponent further says that such assault was committed

with the felonious intent to take the life of deponent, or to do ^{her} ~~him~~ grievous bodily harm; and without any justification on the part of the said assailant :

The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse

Nellie Treacy

of the CRIME OF ASSAULT IN THE FIRST DEGREE, committed as follows :

The said *Nellie Treacy*

late of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the
fourteenth day of *August*, in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and eighty *seven*, with force and arms, at the City and
County aforesaid, in and upon the body of one *Jennie Walsh*,
in the peace of the said People then and there being, feloniously did make an assault,
and *her* the said *Jennie Walsh*,
with a certain *knife* —
which the said *Nellie Treacy*,
in *her* right hand then and there had and held, the same being a deadly and
dangerous weapon then and there wilfully and feloniously did cut, stab and wound,

with intent *her* the said *Jennie Walsh*,
thereby then and there feloniously and wilfully to kill, against the form of the statute
in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of
New York and their dignity.

SECOND COUNT;

And the Grand Jury aforesaid, by this indictment, further accuse the said
Nellie Treacy
of the CRIME OF ASSAULT IN THE SECOND DEGREE, committed as follows :

The said *Nellie Treacy*

late of the City and County aforesaid, afterwards, to wit: on the day and in the
year aforesaid, at the City and County aforesaid, with force and arms, in and
upon the body of the said *Jennie Walsh*,
in the peace of the said People then and there being, feloniously did wilfully and
wrongfully make another assault, and *her* the said

Jennie Walsh,
with a certain *knife* —
which the said *Nellie Treacy*,
in *her*

right hand then and there had and held, the same being
an instrument and weapon likely to produce grievous bodily harm, then and there
feloniously did wilfully and wrongfully cut, stab and wound, against the form of the
statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State
of New York and their dignity.
