The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse
— *William P. Van Dusen* —
of the CRIME OF *Grand* LARCENY, in the second degree, committed
as follows:

The said *William P. Van Dusen*,

late of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the *Twenty first*
day of *December*, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
ninety- *two*, at the City and County aforesaid, being then and there ~~the~~ an
Officer, to wit: of the Treasurer of a certain
association known as the United Tin and
Sheet Iron Workers' Protective and
Benevolent association. —

and as such *Officer and Treasurer* then and there having in his
possession, custody and control certain goods, chattels and personal property of the said
— *association* —

the true owner thereof, to wit: *the sum of three hundred*
and twenty two dollars and thirteen
cents in money, lawful money of
the United States of America, and
of the value of three hundred and
twenty two dollars and thirteen cents, —

the said *William P. Van Dusen*, afterwards, to wit:
on the day and in the year aforesaid, at the City and County aforesaid, with force and arms,
did feloniously appropriate the said *sum of money* —

to his own use, with intent to deprive and defraud the said *association*

of the same, and of the use and benefit thereof; and the same goods, chattels and personal
property of the said *association.* —

did then and there and thereby feloniously steal, against the form of the statute in such case
made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their
dignity.
