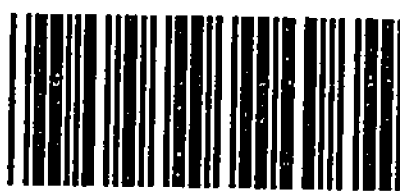

ANNIE SCHEFFLER, a witness for the People, testified:

I live at No. 24 James Street. On the 24th. of
January last I saw this defendant about eleven o'clock
in the forenoon. At that time I had a pocket-book in
my possession containing four dollars and seventy cents
in bills and silver; I had it in the pocket of my
ulster. I saw this defendant put his hand into my
pocket and take the pocket-book out and run away. I
screamed and ran after him and a gentleman caught him. I
am sure this is the man.

CROSS-EXAMINATION:

I am sure I saw his hand in my pocket. He took
the pocket-book out of the pocket and I saw him run with
it; I felt his hand in my pocket; there was a crowd of
people around there.

JOSEPH JACOBS, a witness for the People, testified:

On the 24th. of Jan. last I saw the complainant and I saw the defendant. I was standing at No. 75 Madison Street and I heard a woman scream and I saw this fellow commence to run. He had a poc ket-book in his hand which he threw into the middle of the street. I caught him and held him until an officer came. The pocket-book was afterwards found by the policeman.

CROSS-EXAMINATION:

This happened between 11 and 12 o'clock in the forenoon. There was quite a crowd there and they all got around me when I caught him.

ELLEN FITZGIBBONS, a witness for the People, testified:

On the 24th. of January I saw this prisoner and Mrs. Scheffler in Orchard Street; she was looking in a window and I saw the defendant standing beside her; he turned around suddenly and took the pocket-book; I saw him take the pocket-book and run.

CROSS-EXAMINATION:

I drink whenever I get it.

RENNY SHERIDAN, a witness for the People, testified:

I am a Police Officer attached to the 11th. Precinct/ I arrested this defendant on the 24th. of Jan.

in Orchard St. The complainant identified him as the man who stole her pocket-book.

CROSS-EXAMINATION:

This man came running down Orchard Street and I started to run after him; I was standing on the corner of Ludlow St. and he was coming towards me. There were a great many people running after him. Mr. Jacobs caught him and turned him over to me.

D E F E N D E:

PETER ETHER, the defendant, testified:

I am twenty-two years old and work for a living. I was in Orchard St. on the day in question and when I got near Ludlow St. I saw a lot of people running and I ran to see what was the matter and this gentleman caught hold of me and said "Stop thief". I said "What are you holding me for, I am no thief". Then the officer came and I told him the same thing. Then they found a pocket-book and the woman came over and told the officer that I stole her pocket-book. I did not take that pocket book I did not have it in my hand and I did not throw it away.

CROSS-EXAMINATION:

I was down-town on the morning of this day looking for work. I met a friend of mine in Grand Street and he

went with me; I was coming home when this thing occurred. I do not remember seeing Mrs. Scheffler in Orchard or Madison Street; she did not catch hold of me at all. I simply ran to see what was the matter.

MAURICE D. SOLOMON, a witness for the defendant, testified:

I am a manufacturer of cigars at No. 120 Ridge St. I have known the defendant for the last four years; his character for honesty is good.

CHARLES YOECKER, also testified to the defendant's good character:

CHRISTINA ETNER, the mother of the defendant, testified that her son left the house on the morning of the 24th. of Jan. to go down-town and look for work.

The Jury found the prisoner guilty of grand larceny in the second degree.

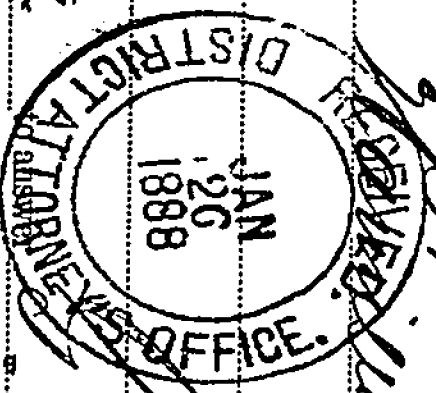
