Dear Sir:

Chapter 659, Section 93, Laws of 1910, contains the following reference to the Board of Parole of the New York City Reformatory of Misdemeanants:

"The commissioner of corrections of the city of New York, two justices of the court of Special Sessions, a city magistrate of the first division, a city magistrate of the second division, and four other persons appointed by the Mayor, shall constitute the board of parole of the said The New York city reformatory for misdemeanants. The said board of parole shall serve without compensation and the present members shall continue in office until the expiration of their terms. The four persons above referred to shall be appointed by the Mayor in the month of January in each year, and shall take office on the first day of February following such appointment, and hold office for one year."
