

A man representing himself to be a Marshall from the Dist. Court ^{to} 407 Second Ave. entered my apartment by force, on the morning of Sept 1st before I had risen, and I was obliged to take refuge in a closet to get away from him as he would not stop in the parlor, but began immediately to

ransack every room and
private closet, until he
found me and then
I was obliged to put
some clothing on in his
presence. When he entered
he shouted in a very
boisterous manner that
he wanted "these things"
Carpets &c, and went to
the front windows and
shouted repeatedly to some
invisible "Bill" in the
street, to "go get a wagon
~~he was~~ I'm going to take
these things." &c. Evidently
to frighten me. and
for what reason I cannot
imagine as he had

not yet served the papers
on me. and I had
never refused to see any
one sent from Hoanes
when they announced
themselves. But he, while
serving for Hoanes' atty
(for a balance of \$23.)
came two or three times
while I was away in
the country and so many
times after my return,
stating that his name
was Abbott, and he
represented a Real Estate
firm down town, not
having nor wishing any
dealing with any Real
Est. firm, I declined
to see him if otherwise
engaged. This morning

(Sept 1st) he did not wait
to hear if I was in before
he pushed the servant
to one side and took
possession of the Apartment.

Now Your Honor, believing
that women alone have
some rights in their own
homes which should be
respected, I appeal to
you to know if this
man (whose name, I at
present, do not know,
did not supersede his
instructions and authority.
Whoever he was, he was
sent to serve me with papers
and had he mentioned his
employer's name, would never
have had any difficulty in
serving me if I was at home.
