

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK  
against  
Giuseppe Unga

The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse

Giuseppe Unga  
of the CRIME OF GRAND LARCENY in the second degree, committed as follows:  
The said Giuseppe Unga

late of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the nineteenth  
day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and  
ninety-three, in the day-time of the said day, at the City and County aforesaid,  
with force and arms,

the sum of six dollars and  
fifty cents in money, lawful money  
of the United States of America, and  
of the value of six dollars and fifty  
cents, two finger-rings of the value of  
five dollars each, one written instrument  
and evidence of contract of the kind called  
fawn-tickets, of the value of two dollars,  
and one pocketbook of the value of  
one dollar

of the goods, chattels and personal property of one Betty Block  
on the person of the said Betty Block  
then and there being found, from the person of the said Betty Block  
then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the statute in  
such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York  
and their dignity.
