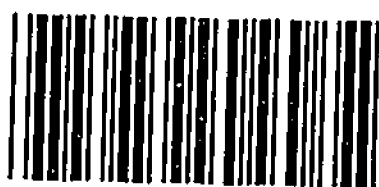

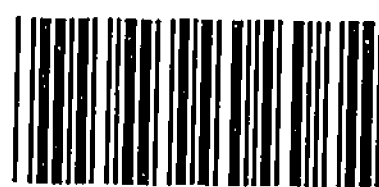

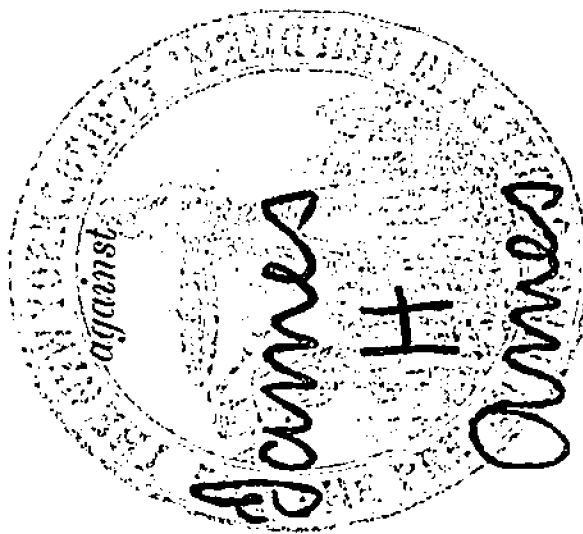

STATEMENT OF THE CASE.

The prisoner, 39 years of age, an Englishman and living at 107 East 11th Street, was indicted for an indecent assault on July 21, 1885, upon three boys, John Carroll aged 10, living with his parents Michael and Maria at 160 East 102nd Street; Edward Martin, living with his parents Robert and Eliza at 172 East 102nd Street; and Felix Donohue living with parents Kiernan and Susan at 158 East 102nd Street.

EVIDENCE.

JOHN CARROLL: - 160 East 102nd Street;

EDWARD MARTIN: - 172 East 102nd Street;

FELIX DONOHUE: - 158 East 102nd Street. After having watched boys bathing at the foot of East 102nd Street, were going home, when about 75 feet from the water met man called Ames. Carroll asked one of the others if his hair was combed all right and man offered his services to arrange it. He then threw Carroll over a log lying on the ground and unbuttoned his pants and took out Carroll's penis and began masturbating it. Carroll told him to let go, and got away, when the prisoner took Martin and used him in the same way. He attempted to use Donohue too but he broke away, and just then the Police officer came up and the man started to run away, and after a chase of five blocks the officer caught him.
