

The jurors of the people of the
State of New York in and for the body
of the City and County of New York
upon their oath present:

That on the nineteenth day of
August in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and seventy nine
at the City of New York in the County of
New York there was existing in full and
lawful force and effect a certain penal
ordinance of "The Mayor Aldermen and
Commonalty of the City of New York" and
of the Common Council of the City of
New York, which had theretofore been and
was then and there duly and regularly
passed, adopted and approved by the
said "The Mayor Aldermen and Common-
alty of the City of New York" and the
Common Council of aforesaid and which
said ordinance is as follows that is to
say:

The Mayor of the City of New York may
grant licenses to such and so many
persons as he may deem proper to keep
and use such number of dirt carts as
he shall think expedient, to be employed
exclusively with the carting and

transportation of dirt, sand, gravel, clay, paving stones, ashes, garbage, and building rubbish, and revoke or suspend any or all such license at his pleasure; and it shall not be lawful for any person to drive or use any cart wagon or other vehicle for the transportation of any such dirt, sand, gravel, clay, paving stones, ashes, garbage or building rubbish, within the City of New York for hire, wages or pay for such transportation unless the said cart or other vehicle be licensed as aforesaid:

And the jurors aforesaid upon their oath aforesaid do further present:

That John Walsh on the said nineteenth day of August in the year aforesaid at the said City and County of New York did knowingly intentionally and unlawfully use and drive a certain cart wagon and vehicle for the transportation of, and wherein he the said John Walsh did then and there transport dirt, sand, gravel and clay within the City and County aforesaid, for hire wages and pay, the said cart wagon and vehicle being then and there not licensed therefor by the Mayor of the City of New York against the form of the

provided and against the peace of
the people of the State of New York
and their dignity.
