of the CRIME OF GRAND LARCENY in the second degree, committed as follows:

late of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the 54th day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, in the day time of the said day, at the City and County aforesaid, with force and arms,
