THE GRAND JURY OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF NEW YORK, by

this indictment, accuse Louis Gettel -

of the CRIME OF GRAND LARCENY IN THE first DEGREE, committed as follows:

The said Louis Gettel,

of the ward of the late of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the 27th day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety, at the City and County aforesaid, with force and arms, in the night - time of the same day, divers promissory notes for the payment of money, being then and there due and unsatisfied (and of the kind known as United States Treasury Notes), of a number and denomination to the Grand Jury aforesaid unknown, for the payment of and of the value of \$45.00 forty-five

dollars; divers other promissory notes for the payment of money, being then and there due and unsatisfied (and of the kind known as Bank Notes), of a number and denomination to the Grand Jury aforesaid unknown, for the payment of and of the value of

forty-five dollars; divers United States Silver Certificates of a number and denomination to the Grand Jury aforesaid unknown of the value of

forty-five dollars; divers United States Gold Certificates of a number and denomination to the Grand Jury aforesaid unknown, of the value of

forty-five dollars; divers coins of a number, kind and denomination to the Grand Jury aforesaid unknown, of the value of forty-five dollars

of the goods, chattels and personal property of one Bertha Finninger, in the dwelling house of the said Bertha Finninger, there situated then and there being found, from the dwelling house aforesaid then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the Statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity.
