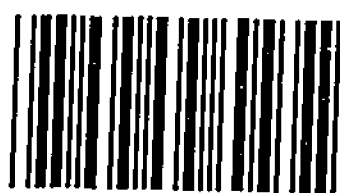

 Indictment for grand larceny in the first degree.
 Amelia Miles sworn and examined, testified.
 I live 4 Marion St. I remember the 3^d of this
 month. I was just returning home from the
 butchers, I had my meat and cheese and
 pocket book in my hand, it contained \$2.95
 in money. I saw the prisoner coming towards
 me very suspiciously, he came against
 me and hit my shoulder (I had my
 little one with me) he grabbed my hand
 and took the pocket book and ran. I
 have not the least doubt but he is the man.
 Cross Examined. I never saw him before
 this night, it was done in a twinkling, I was
 not by my stoop going up stairs. I was
 about ten feet from the stoop. He took
 the cheese and the pocket book out of
 my hand. I was in the station house when
 the prisoner was brought in. I was pos-
 itive then that he was the man. I did
 not say there that he was not the person.
 I said I was very much excited at the time. I
 am positive I said he was the boy. I
 should judge he was arrested between
 eleven and twelve o'clock. I was at home
 when they came for me. I do not know

who the gentleman was that came for me. He told me I was wanted at the station house but he did not tell me what for. The Captain or Sergeant asked me if that was the boy took my pocket book and I said he was. He was coming from Brown St. and he walked towards me. He wrenched the pocket book out of my hand. My little girl screamed and I ran after him. I saw his face. I don't know anybody else who looks exactly like him in the neighborhood. I gave a description to the officer of a red headed boy because I noticed his sandy hair. I saw him plainly enough; he wore a Derby hat. I never found my pocket book.

John Hodder, sworn and examined, testified. I am an officer of police, made the arrest in this case, brought the boy to the station house, sent for the complainant and she came there and identified the boy. Cross Examined. She identified him as she came into the house first; she turned him around and looked at his hair; he had a certain mark on his ear and identified him right away. I do not know the mark in the ear.

0601

Amelia Miles, recalled for the defence. I chased the boy near to Spring st. and then the crowd gathered around me and when I got to the corner of Spring st. I knew I could not chase him any further. I was out of breath and I left my little one standing by the stoop. The mark is a mole on the ear. When I was running two ladies said, "That is red Ennis, you look at his ear and you will see a mole on his ear. When I went to the station house I recognized the boy without anything, but to make sure I looked for the mark on his ear.

Francis Ennis, sworn and examined, in his own behalf testified. I live 157 Mott st. I remember the night I was arrested in Mott st No 231, at a saloon. That night about ten o'clock I had been home in the house. I left it to go to this saloon about eleven o'clock. I was arrested because my name was Red Ennis. I did not see the lady who was in the stand that night at any time from eight to twelve o'clock. I did not take her pocketbook. I saw her at the station house; the Sergeant said to her, Is this the boy that took your pocket book? I turned around; she said, "no."

The Sergeant said, "That is Red Ennis." She is, That is the boy and she turned around; she identified me by something on my ear. My business is a ruler of bank books. I have been working in R. H. Macey & Co. I was arrested once for disorderly conduct and got five days. Cross Examined. I was delivering "stuff" at Macey's. The boys call me "Red Ennis." The Lager Beer Saloon at 231 Mott St. has a pool table. I was in there when I was arrested. I was in there the night before that. I am in there three or four times a week.

Michael Costello sworn and examined. Where do you live? No 220 Mott St. What is your business? I work on the Corporation. Do you know this defendant Ennis? Yes sir. How long have you known him? I know him going on four years. Has he worked for you? Yes sir, he worked for me off and on since I knew him. I know him to be a good honest boy.

John Hoden recalled. You heard the statement as to the number of times that this lady failed to recognize him made by the prisoner? Is that true? No sir. I have been an officer in that precinct going on four years. I know the

reputation of the prisoner for honesty. It is very poor; I have had several complaints against him; the last time he was arrested it was for stealing fruit.

The jury rendered a verdict of guilty.

He was sent to the Elmira Reformatory.
