

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, against

John Alsonon

THE GRAND JURY OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF NEW YORK, by this indictment, accuse John Alsonon of the CRIME OF GRAND LARCENY IN THE first DEGREE, committed as follows:

The said John Alsonon

late of the City of New York in the County of New York aforesaid, on the eighth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one at the City and County aforesaid, with force and arms, in the night-time of said day, divers promissory notes for the payment of money, being then and there due and unsatisfied (and of the kind known as United States Treasury Notes), of a number and denomination to the Grand Jury aforesaid unknown, for the payment of and of the value of fifteen

dollars; divers other promissory notes for the payment of money, being then and there due and unsatisfied (and of the kind known as Bank Notes), of a number and denomination to the Grand Jury aforesaid unknown, for the payment of and of the value of fifteen

dollars; divers United States Silver Certificates, of a number and denomination to the Grand Jury aforesaid unknown, of the value of fifteen

dollars; divers United States Gold Certificates, of a number and denomination to the Grand Jury aforesaid unknown, of the value of fifteen

dollars; ~~divers coins of a number, kind and denomination to the Grand Jury aforesaid unknown, of the value of~~ fifteen dollars

of the goods, chattels and personal property of one Giuseppe Spigonardo, on the person of the said Giuseppe Spigonardo, then and there being found, from the person of the said Giuseppe Spigonardo then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity.
