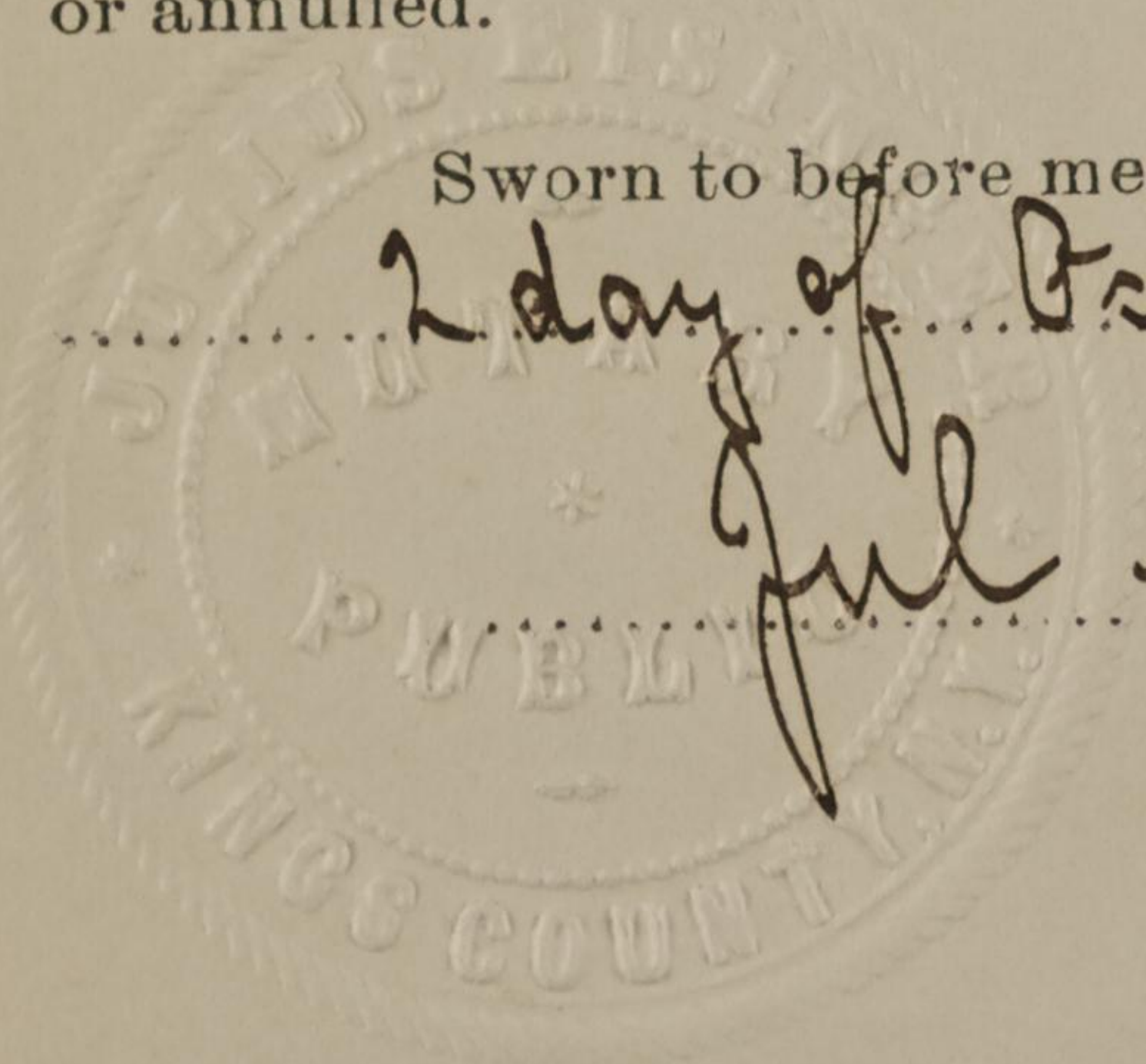
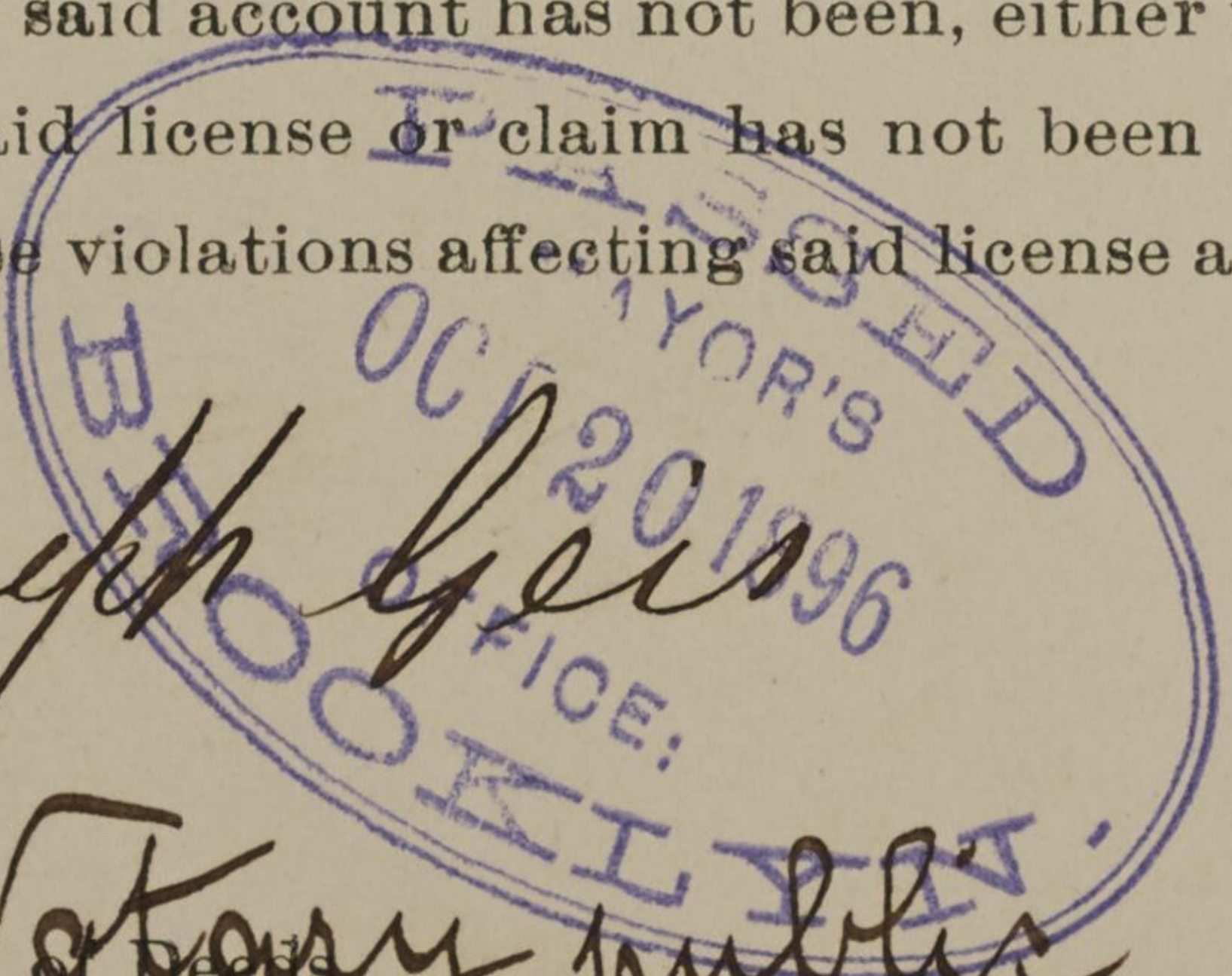

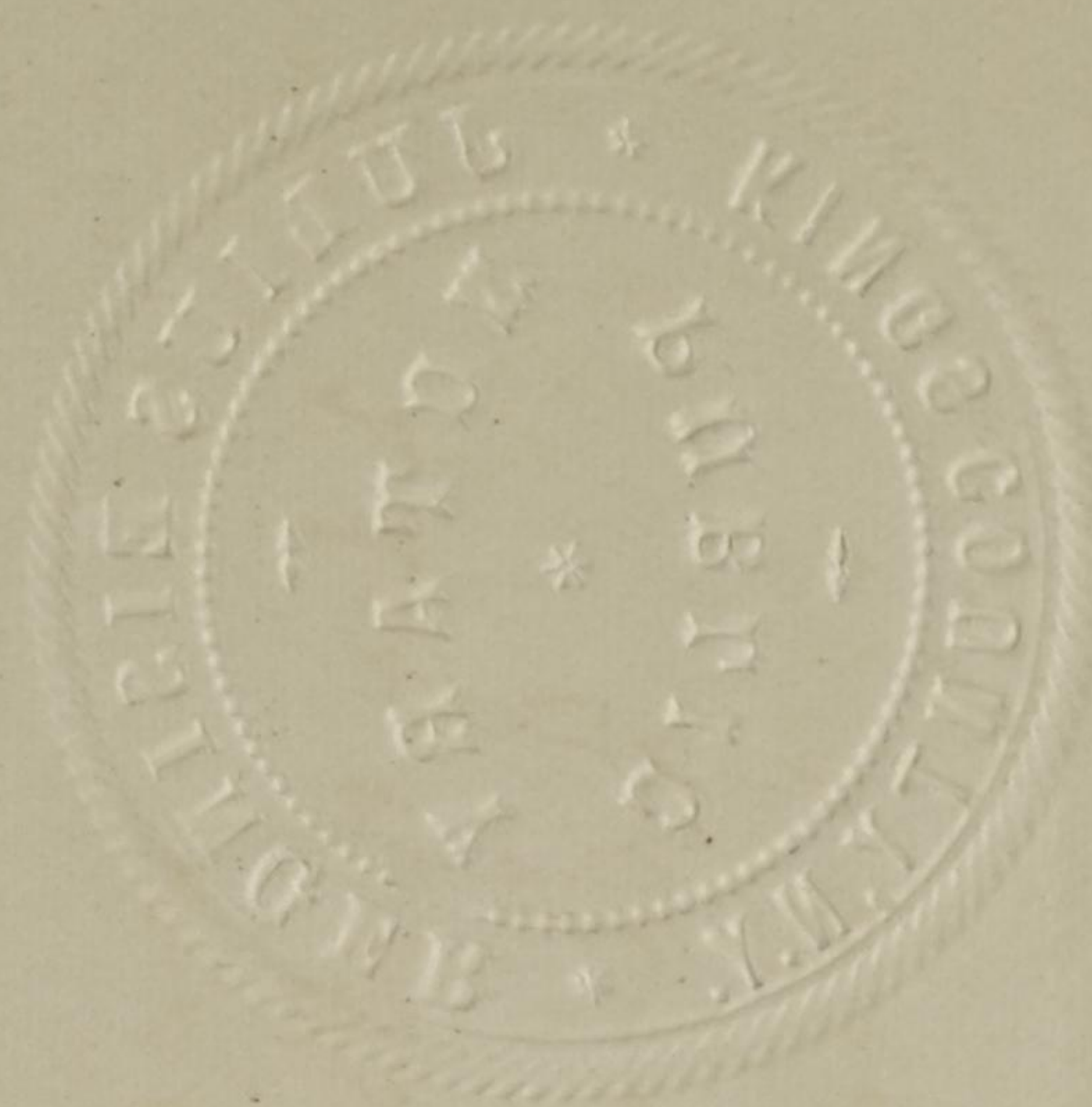

Joseph Geis, being duly sworn says that he is the affiant in the annexed affidavit; that two or three days before July 1<sup>st</sup> 1896, deponent returned to his store at 700 Flushing Ave. from the excise office with his new license under the present statute, and thereupon took down from the wall the license referred to in the annexed affidavit and told his daughter, who was present, that it was no longer of any value, and she thereupon in the presence of deponent burned up said license together with the old licenses of the two preceding years; that deponent has carried on the saloon business for over three years at said place and has always taken out a license in his own name and paid the license fees out of his own money, and that no person ever had any claim or right of such licenses; that deponent makes this affidavit and these representations as an inducement to the City of Brooklyn to pay to him the rebate of the license fee on said license expiring Aug. 15<sup>th</sup> 1896, and knowing that such payment, if made, will be made upon the faith of and in reliance upon this affidavit.

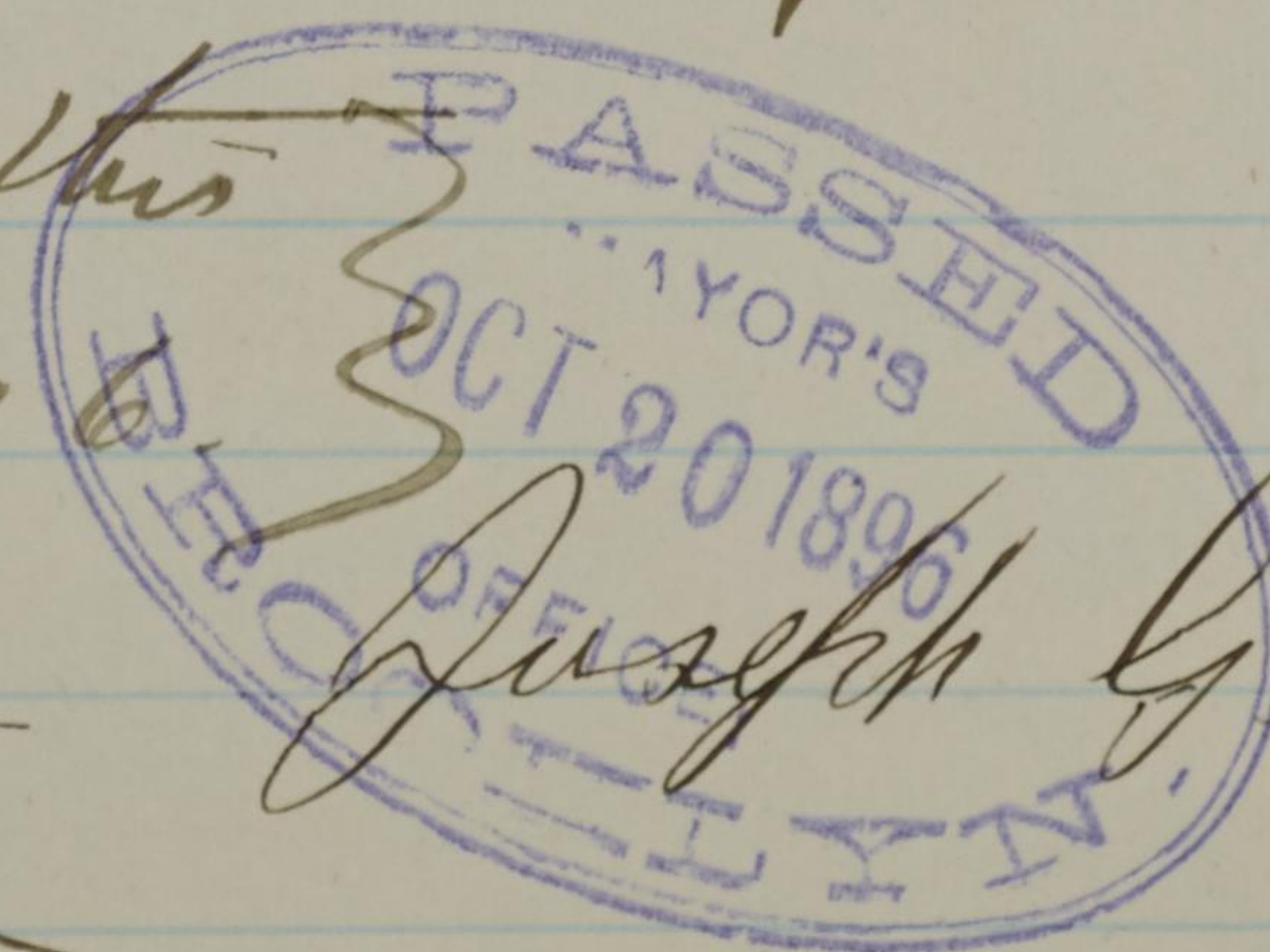

who being duly sworn, stated and de-  
posed, as follows:

On the 5<sup>th</sup> day of August 1895 a license  
for the sale of liquor at the premises known  
as No 700 Plushing Ave, City of Brooklyn N.Y.  
has been granted and issued in and for my  
name Joseph Geis by the Honorable Board  
of Excise, said license was dated the  
15<sup>th</sup> day of August 1896, bearing the No 3211  
Stub No 2950 and expired on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of  
August 1896 but was cancelled by the new  
liquor tax law July 1<sup>st</sup> 1896.

The said license has been destroyed by  
fire, through negligence and can therefore  
not be produced in original for rebate due  
for the same, for its unexpired term, and  
further deponent said that the same was &  
is free from all incumbrances.
