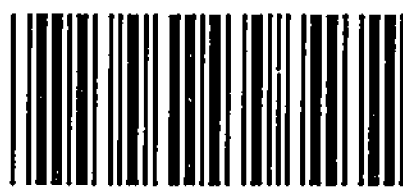

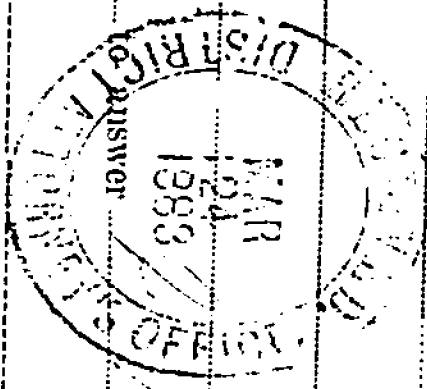

of the CRIME OF *Assault in the first degree*, committed as follows:

The said *Sonno Zimmermann*

late of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the *twenty fourth* day of *March* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty *three* with force and arms, at the City and County aforesaid, in and upon the body of *Philip Oswald* in the peace of the said People then and there being, feloniously did make an assault, and to, at and against *him* the said *Philip Oswald* a certain *pistol* then and there loaded and charged with gunpowder and one leaden bullet, which the said *Sonno Zimmermann* in *his* right hand then and there had and held, the same being a deadly and dangerous weapon, wilfully and feloniously, did then and there shoot off and discharge, with intent *to kill* the said *Philip Oswald* thereby then and there feloniously and wilfully to kill, against the form of the Statute in such case made and provided. and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity.

SECOND COUNT.

And the Grand Jury aforesaid, by this indictment, further accuse the said

Sonno Zimmermann of the Crime of assault in the second degree, committed as follows:

The said *Sonno Zimmermann*

afterwards, to wit, on the day and in the year aforesaid, at the City and County aforesaid, with force and arms, in and upon the body of the said *Philip Oswald* then and there being, feloniously did, wilfully and wrongfully, make an assault, and to, at and against *him* the said *Philip Oswald* a certain *pistol* then and there loaded and charged with gunpowder and one leaden bullet, which *he* the said *Sonno Zimmermann* in *his* right hand, then and there had and held, the same being an instrument likely to produce grievous bodily harm, feloniously did, wilfully and wrongfully then and there shoot off and discharge

against the form of the Statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity.

duly sworn deposes and says: I am 20 years of
age, have resided with my parents No. 55 East
Houston St. in this City, On the 24th of March 1873
I attended a Ball at Valhalla Hall in Orchard
Street between Grand and Hester Streets, in this
City, I left the ball at about 5 A.M. on the
morning of March 25th Inst, at which time the
affair was over, as soon as I came out of
the door of the hall on Orchard Street, I was
attacked and beaten by a crowd of about
ten men, I was struck with a heavy instru-
ment, I ran into the middle of the street
and these persons ran after me, and one
of them gave me a blow which threw me
down on the pavement, I managed to get up
again, and started to run when they all
made a rush for me; I intended to frighten
them away, believing myself in great
danger, I drew a ~~revolver~~ revolver, and to
intimidate my assailants, I fired one shot,
and ran, the whole crowd started in my
pursuit, I was afraid that they would

kill me and ran for my life and to preserve myself from their attack.

I had never seen the complainant before that, I did not know him, I did not intend him any harm or to do him any injury, he was accidentally struck with the ball from my revolver, I did not aim the revolver at the complainant, when I fired the shot I believed my life to be in danger.
