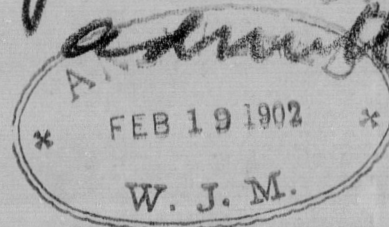


Gentlemen:-

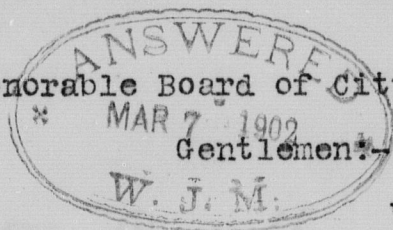

II. It is a reputable newspaper and known as such.



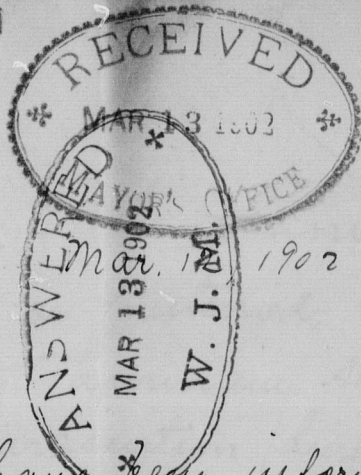

My dear Sir:

I have been informed that at a meeting of the Board of City Record held on Monday, that the Northside News and the Bronx Borough Record were designated by the Board to publish City Notices for the Borough of the Bronx.

The designation of the Northside News, which supported the Tammany Ticket at the last election, and was especially bitter against Hon. James L. Wells, the candidate for President of the Borough, certainly comes as a surprise to those who have fought Tammany for years, and loyally supported you.

We do not claim much, but can prove that our loyalty and

sacrifice in behalf of the Fusion
administration cannot be questioned.
Our strong opposition to Tammany sub-
jected us to bitter persecution during
the four years of its reign in office.
Scores of petty complaints was made
against our small office building, going
so far as to make the attempt to
have it torn down. Taxes ^{on the valuation} on the lot
of ground we lease was far in excess
of what they should be. For a building
costing \$500, we were assessed \$1,000. Ever
since annexation in 1895, as our paper
shows, we have stood for honest
Government. I refer you to Dr F M.
Clendenen, and other prominent citizens
of this section, if this is not true.

To make this sacrifice, and
have the administration which

we loyally supported, give what ever newspaper patronage it has to a Tammany paper, does not seem fair. Did Tammany Hall give any patronage to a Republican paper, or one that stood for honest government in this section? It did not. It tried to crush such papers out of existence. It is in the spirit of fairness, and justice, that I write to you. It is a struggle to conduct a newspaper in this Borough, and come out plain for honest government. They are willing to make as great a sacrifice as any, but when Tammany tries to crush us out of existence, and the administration that we supported, refuses to give us any support, ~~as~~ it naturally makes us stop and think. I think you
