





Mr. E. Raper Med. being sworn says: I have made an Autopsy on the body of Catherine Powers lying dead at the Chamber St. Hospital on the 23rd day of June 1880 with the following results. Body well nourished, but very anaemic. Found a slight swelling of left foot and Oedema of left leg and thigh. Rigor mortis is well marked. Brain - very anaemic but otherwise normal. Blood - very fluid. Heart - muscular fibres flabby and anaemic. Lower lobe of right lung - congested and oedematous; entire ~~the~~ lower lobe of left lung was found intensely congested. Pericardium contained no excess of fluid and no signs of Pericarditis. Pleurae show no old adhesions and no signs of Pleurisy. Abdomen contained no fluid nor was there a symptom of Peritonitis, either general or local. Liver was found enlarged and slightly fatty. Spleen - very friable. Right kidney was found to be rather large but otherwise normal; left kidney presented a small cyst on its surface in upper end but was otherwise normal. Both kidneys, like the other organs, were very anaemic. Womb was normal but excessively anaemic.

From the Autopsy I find that death was caused by secondary post-mortem hemorrhage due to the violence inflicted.
