THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK

against

Edward Unager

The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse

Edward Unager

of the CRIME of Murder in the first degree, —

committed as follows:

The said Edward Unager,

late of the Thirteenth Ward of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the Twentieth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, at the Ward, City and County aforesaid,

with force and arms, in and upon the body of one August Beale, in the year of the said Beale, then and there unlawfully, feloniously and of his malice aforethought, did make an assault, and the said Edward Unager, with a certain hammer which he the said Edward Unager in his right hand then and there had and held, in the said August Beale, in and upon the head of him the said August Beale, then and there unlawfully, feloniously and of his malice aforethought did strike, beat, bruise, wound and fracture, giving into him the said August Beale,

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then and there with the manner
aforesaid, in and upon the head of
him the said August Bodde, one
mortal wound and fracture, of the
length of four inches, of the breadth
of three inches, and of the depth of
two inches, of which said mortal wound
and fracture the said August Bodde
then and there died.

And so the Grand Jury aforesaid do
say: That the said Edward Unzer, from
the said August Bodde, in manner and
form and by the means aforesaid,
willfully, feloniously and of his malice
aforethought, did kill and murder, against
the form of the Statute in such case
made and provided, and against the
peace of the People of the State of
New York, and their dignity

Second Count.

And the Grand Jury aforesaid, by
this Indictment further accuse the said
Edward Unzer of the crime of Murder
in the first degree, committed as follows:

The said Edward Unzer, late of the

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Ward, Fitch and County of Essex, Essex-
wards, to wit: on the day and in the
year aforesaid, at the Ward, Fitch and
County aforesaid, with force and arms,
in and upon the body of one August
Biddle, in the name of the said Biddle,
then and there unlawfully feloniously
and of his malice aforethought, did make
an assault, and in some way and manner,
and by some means, instruments and
weapons to the regard of the said
indamoun, the said Edward Unger did
then and there unlawfully feloniously and
of his malice aforethought, inflict upon
the said August Biddle, certain mortal
injuries, of which description hereafter is to
the regard of the said indamoun, of
which said mortal injuries, the said
August Biddle then and there died. And
so the said Edward Unger, did, in the
manner and form aforesaid, unlawfully
feloniously and of his malice afore-
thought, kill and murder the said
August Biddle; against the form of
the Statute in such case made and
provided, and against the peace of
the People of the State of New York,
and their dignity.
