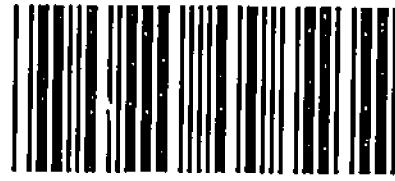

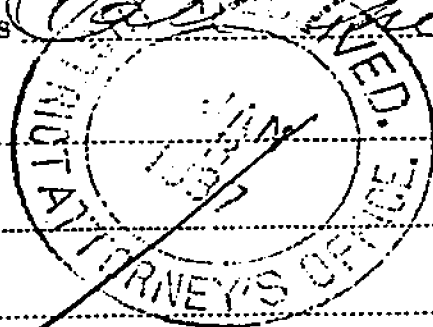

The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse

*- Harry Voodner -*

of the CRIME OF GRAND LARCENY IN THE *second* DEGREE, committed  
as follows:

The said *Harry Voodner,*

late of the First Ward of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the  
*Twenty third* day of *December*, in the year of our Lord  
one thousand eight hundred and eighty- *six* —, at the City and County aforesaid,  
with force and arms,

*Two Shavers of the value of*  
*four dollars each, one brush*  
*of the value of fifty cents,*  
*one pair of gloves of the value*  
*of two dollars, and two watches*  
*of the value of eight dollars*  
*each,*

of the goods, chattels and personal property of one

*John M. Batherley,*

then and there being found, then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away,  
against the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of  
the People of the State of New York, and their dignity.
